The Resolution directing the Bank Depositories for the year 1945, was adopted by the board.

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE FOLLOWING
COUNTY OFFICIALS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY,
KANSAS, TO DEPOSIT ALL MONIES RECEIVED
BY THEM IN THEIR OFFICIAL CAPACITIES
IN THE BANKS AS DESIGNATED AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, it is required that the Board of County Commissioners comply with Section 9-302-303, General Statutes of Kansas, 1935, designating depositories for all public monies received by county officials in their official capacities.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session this 17th day of January, 1945, that all county officials named herein deposit all public monies received by them in their official capacities in the banks as designated below, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all banks so listed below shall be the depositories in which monies shall be deposited by said officials of Douglas County, Kansas:

January 24, 1945

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session, all members of the board being present.

E. S. Dillon presented his receipt for taxes paid on cattle assessed in Franklin County, and asked that his assessment in Douglas County be reduced proportionately, which amount would be \$640.00 and represents a double assessment on the cattle which he purchased in Franklin County March 1st, 1944. The Board authorized Mr. Gerhart, County Clerk, to issue an order adjusting Mr. Dillon's taxes as follows:

Order No. 371 To cancel 1944 tax in Willow Springs Township assessed against Parsons & Dillon as follows: School District 38, Tangible Value \$1810.00, Tangible Tax \$26.17. Add tax in Willow Springs Township, assessed against Parsons & Dillon, Route 2, Lawrence, Kansas, as follows: School District 38, Tangible Value \$1170.00, Tangible Tax \$16.92. Double assessment on 8 head of cattle, receipt for which has been issued from Franklin County and presented to the Board of Commissioners.

The balance of the day was spent in closed session with the County Welfare Board and with D. L. McFarlane, Ben Johnson and Frank Durein, of the State Welfare Board.

The Board adjourned.
