RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the matter of the assessment against H. H. Harris, 802 Massachusetts, came on for consideration of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, at a regular adjourned meeting, this 28th day of March, 1945, said assessment having been certified to the Sheriff of Douglas County for collection, under Warrant No. 633, and

WHEREAS there is now due and owing on said assessment and Warrant, the sum of seventy eight cents plus interest and penalties, and it having been proven to the satisfaction of this Board the above assessment was erroneously made on property in Baldwin City, and should have been made against another person and not against H. H. Harris,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the Clerk of the District Court be ordered to cancel the tax of \$0.78 and all interest and penalties due thereon under said Warrant, a total amount of \$1.40, as charged against H. H. Harris.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session, all members of the Board being present.

The regular monthly claims for payroll were approved and allowed as per the allowance record.

E.E. Larson, County Engineer, E. H. Sanders and Clyde Conner appeared before the board in connection with plans for running LoneStar Lake and Park this year. The following is the list of cabins owned by the County and the lessees of the cabins that are rented as of this date:

It was agreed that Sanders would continue with the boat concession, sandwiches, soft drinks, etc., as in the past, but Conner who is to be the new caretaker, is to sell the fishing licenses, both state and county. Mr. Sanders contract was re-written giving him the use of building 18, which is the house where he lives. Mr. Sanders said he purchased the wires and light sockets in building #1, and the cost was approximately \$4.00. The Commissioners asked Mr. Sanders to present a bill for the correct amount and the county would pay him for the wire and sockets.

Mr. Clyde Conner is to be paid \$100.00 a month as care taker at the park, plus a ten cent fee for each license sold.

Mrs. Magruder appeared before the board, asking for a place in the court house to hold a public meeting at which a speaker from the Headquarters office of the Watch Tower organization in
