RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED BY the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the attention of all county officials again be called to the fact that it is illegal to create any county indebtedness without a corresponding charge against the cash funds AT THE TIME the obligation is assumed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk hereby is instructed not to issue Purchase Orders after June 1st, 1945 for supplies and services ordered by County Officials without submitting requisitions at the time the purchase is made or order given.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any official who does not comply with the provisions of the Cash Basis Law in the above respect becomes personally liable for bills incurred, and must appear before the Board for any adjustments.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session, as the Board of Equalization, all members of the board being present.

John W. Brand appeared before the board, asking that the valuation on his property at 1100 Ohio Street, be reduced. The property and valuations are as follows:

Lot 162 Ohio Street	900.
Improvements	2000.
Lot 164 Ohio Street	900
Improvements	1200.
Total	5000.

Mr. Brand stated the purchase price for the property was \$4275, and the property was formerly the Congregational parsonage. Upon further inquiry, the board noted Mr. Brand had obtained a loan of \$4500.00 at the time he purchased the property. The valuations of the surrounding properties vary. Inasmuch as the Board wishes to view this land before taking any action, the matter of reduction was taken under advisement.

The Board adjourned to sit as the Board of County Commissioners to consider county business.

The Palmyra Township Board met with the Board of Commissioners as requested to discuss the condition of the road along the North and West sides of Section 19-14-21, as petitioned by John Chanay and others, to be graded and rocked. After discussion with the Board of Commissioners, the Township board agreed to grade and rock the road as requested.

A bid was presented by Eugene Brune, proposing to install radiators in the West entry of the first floor, 1 in the third floor hall, 1 in the general office of the 3rd floor, and 1 in the superintendent's office. No action was taken on the bid this day, but was taken under consideration.

No further business, the board adjourned until Thursday, May 24th.
