22 girls in the group and the use of the canteen for 4 days would be necessary, if the girl scouts were to have camp. Permission was granted the colored girl scouts to have camp at the lake and the use of the canteen for 4 days, on the condition Mr. Conner the caretaker had not already booked the canteen for some other group.

*Mrs. Gaines asked permission to use canteen for girl scouts*

Mrs. Gaines also asked for the first chance to lease the canteen for the girl scouts, if and when the County decides to lease the canteen to any group or groups. Mrs. Gaines also asked for permission to store the double decked beds which the girl scouts use, in the side entrance for the winter. The Board instructed Mrs. Gaines to discuss the storage of the beds with Mr. Conner, and if it is agreeable with Mr. Conner, the Board grants its permission. Mrs. Gaines also told the board of a leak in one of the pipes where the scouts have their shower and the water is standing in puddles, and the ruts in the roadway are full of water from the seepage. Mr. Griffith said the road would eventually be repaired as soon as the road crew could find the time to fix it.

Sheriff Skinner asked the board for an increase in the fee for feeding prisoners at the jail. The present fee is 75¢ per prisoner, per day. After some discussion, it was agreed to increase the fee to \$1.00 per prisoner, per day, beginning with the month of June.

A tax affidavit signed by Leonard H. Axe, Director of the Navy V-12 Program at the University of Kansas, was presented in behalf of John Malloy who was stationed at the University temporarily with the Naval Unit. Mr. Malloy was assessed for taxes in 1944, and under the orders issued by the State Commission of Revenue and Taxation, was not taxable since his actual residence was not in the State of Kansas. The Board adopted the following resolution, cancelling Mr. Malloy's 1944 tax which has been reduced to Judgment:

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the matter of the assessment against John Malloy, 600 Louisiana Street, Lawrence, Kansas, came on for consideration of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, at a regular adjourned meeting this 15th day of June, 1945, said assessment appearing on the tax roll as against John H. Malloy, 600 Louisiana Street, and

WHEREAS, the tax is now past due and delinquent, and has been certified to the Sheriff of Douglas County for collection as Warrant No. 356, and the Warrant has been delivered to the Clerk of the District Court as a personal tax judgment and is entered in Judgment Docket 6, page 172 of the records of the Clerk of the District Court, in the amount of \$13.57 plus fees and interest, and

WHEREAS, it is now called to the attention of the Board of County Commissioners of said Douglas County, the said John H. Malloy was stationed at the University of Kansas temporarily, acting as a Navy Officer in the Naval Training School, and according to the provisions of the Soldiers and Sailors Civil Relief Act is exempt from taxation inasmuch as said John Malloy was resident of the State of California and not of the State of Kansas,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, the Clerk of the District Court be ordered to cancel said personal property tax judgment against John H. Malloy which is described as

Warrant No. 356, John H. Malloy, in the sum of \$13.57 plus fees and interest, filed on March 10, 1945,

together with all interest and penalties due thereon under said warrant.

Harold Beck, Register of Deeds, appeared before the board, asking for an increase in pay for his office help, Vanata C. Glennon. Mrs. Glennon is now getting \$105.00 and after some discussion, Mrs. Glennon's salary was increased to \$125.00 beginning with the June payroll. Mr. Beck also asked for some extra help, and a photostatic machine, which machine is estimated at \$1600.00. The requests for the extra help and the machine were both turned down for the present.

Since office supplies and paper are so hard to obtain, Mr. Gerhart, County Clerk, suggested the supplies for the 1946 Primary and General Elections should be ordered. It was moved by Mr. Penny, the County Clerk be authorized to order the supplies for the 1946 primary and general elections, said supplies to be purchased on the same basis as for the year 1944. Mr. Johnson seconded the motion, and on vote called the motion carried.

The following resolutions and contracts were adopted for construction of certain bridges in Douglas County:

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission has included in its program for approval by the Public Roads Administration a project for the construction of a Secondary Bridge in the County of Douglas and designated as Kansas Project No. 23 FAS 196 A (1) and,

WHEREAS, fifty per cent. of the cost of said project is to be paid for with funds obtained under the provisions of the Federal Highway Act as amended and supplemented.

NOW THEREFORE, it is Resolved by the Governing Body that in the event the above named project is approved and constructed as a Federal Aid Project and as called for in the plans and specifications, that the County will each year, at its own cost and expense, maintain the project in a manner satisfactory to the Public Roads Administration and the State Highway Commission.
