The Board adjourned to meet with the officials from Leavenworth County, at the bridge at Eudora connecting Leavenworth and Douglas Counties. The following officials from Leavenworth County were present: Sam Warden, Chairman of the Leavenworth Board of County Commissioners, and Commissioners Lon Rush and Ted Morrow, Al Maduska, County Engineer, and Jesse A. Hall, County Attorney. The entire board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, County Clerk T.R.Gerhart and County Engineer E.E. Larson, attended the meeting.

After viewing the Kansas River at the Bridge, it was agreed by both boards, to call Col. Meff of the U.S. Engineers office in Kansas City, and Geo. S. Knapp of the Kansas Water Resources department for a consultation on the Eudora bridge situation, on Monday, July 2nd.

No further business, the meeting adjourned.

July 2, 1945

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, met in regular session, all members of the board being present.

The regular claims for payroll and supplies were approved and allowed as per the Allowance Record.

The County Clerk was authorized to purchase four electric water coolers from Wright Appliances, at the cost of \$790.00 delivered. The charge for installation of coolers to be in addition to the purchase price.

The Board adjourned to meet again with the Leavenworth Board of County Commissioners, and County Engineer, with Clare Van Orman, Design Engineer from the U.S. Engineer's office in Kansas City, Geo. S. Knapp of the Kansas Water Resources Department and Mr. Kohler from the Emporia office of the A.T. & S.F. railroad.

The visiting engineers recommended a survey to be made of the Kaw River immediately above the Eudora Bridge, the survey to be presented Geo. S. Knapp, who with the help of the two county engineers, is to prepare the control system of the stream and make recommendations, plans and estimates which are to be presented to the Boards of the two counties. The Boards of both Douglas and Leavenworth Counties agreed to follow the recommendation of the Engineers, the cost of the work to be paid by both counties.

J. L. Constant of the Constant Construction Co. checked the roof of the Court house, which has been leaking in several places. The Board also looked at the roof, and Mr. Constant was asked to submit an estimate on the work needed to be done at the next meeting of the board.

No further business, the board adjourned to meet Thursday, July 5th.
