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August 29, 1945

The Board of County Commissioners, met in regular adjourned session, all members of the board being present.

The Clinton Township Board met with the board of Commissioners in response to the invitation of the board in regard to the road petition signed by E.C. Bond and others, asking the county to maintain the township road as described in the petition now on file in the County Clerk's office. After citing Section 68-124 of the General Statutes of Kansas, 1935, to the Clinton board, said township board agreed to improve and maintain the road.

The Street and alley committee from the City Council, accompanied by City Attorney Clarence Correll, City Clerk Harold Fisher and City Engineer, Clifford Harper, met with the board of county commissioners in response to a request from that board. The Street and alley committee had been instructed by the City Council to act favorably on any question that arose in connection with the paving of Louisiana Street and road adjoining. The motion was made by Mr. Penny appointing Clifford Harper, City Engineer, as project engineer for the grading, curbing and paving of Louisiana Street and a highway adjacent thereto and extending from the intersection of 19th Street and Louisiana Street to 23rd Street in the City of Lawrence, said engineer to prepare plans and specifications and to submit the same together with estimates to the joint board. Mr. Johnson seconded the motion, and on vote called, the motion carried. Mr. Riling, County Attorney, questioned the legality of such action, stating the statutes of Kansas, specifically state the joint board shall be composed of the city officials and the county board, and all action taken after the adoption of the final resolutions must be made by the joint board. After consulting the City Attorney, it was the opinion of the board of County Commissioners and the County Attorney, the Board of County Commissioners should meet with the City Council at its regular meeting on Monday Evening, September 10th.

The remainder of the day was spent with the Welfare Department.

No further business, the board adjourned.
