## October 24, 1945

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular adjourned session, all members-of the board being present.

Resolutions No. 1848 and 1849 as passed by the City Council of the City of Lawrence, presented to the Board. After some discussion the following action was taken on Resolution No. 1849 which provides for the grading, curbing, paving and otherwise improving Barkor Avenue from Twentieth Street to Twenty-Third Street, determining the kind of curbing and pavement, declaring and defining a benefit district within the City of Lawrence, and describing the lands, lots and blocks within such district to be assessed to pay the costs thereof. 5

"To the Governing Body, of Lawrence, Kansas. At our regular meeting held on the above date, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, considered Resolution #1849 regarding the grading, curbing, paving and otherwise improving Barker Avenue from 20th Street to 23rd Street.

This is to advise that the Board of County Commissioners does not feel at this time that the above project can be carried out for the reason the 1935 General Statutes of Kansas, Sections 14-510 and 14-511 provides that two-tenths (2/10) of the cost of said project should be paid from the road fund of said county. Not so long ago this county went on a cash basis and therefore, it has no funds with which to proceed with such a project.

Should the governing body of Lawrence, Kansas determine or find that the paving of the above street could be accomplished by having the land owners pay the complete cost of said project by assessment, then the County Commissioners feel they might give the project favorable consideration."

Resolution No. 1848 providing for the improvement of Haskell Avenue from 13th to 14th Streets, was accompanied by the original petition signed by property owners living in the 1300 block on the West side of Haskell Avenue. The County Attorneyvas instructed to prepare a Resolution accepting the resolution of the City Council and declaring the improvement of said block on Haskell Avenue, a public utility.

The following resolution was adopted by the Board of Commissioners designating bank depositories for Public Funds, to be used by Roy Flory, County Treasurer:

RESOLUTION DESIGNATING BANK DEPOSITORIES FOR PUBLIC FUNDS

Whereas, the bond of Roy Flory, Treasurer of Douglas County, is now being accepted and approved, and

WHEREAS, as provided in Section 9-305 of the 1941 Supplement to the General Statutes of Kansas, 1935, the Board of County Commissioners is given authority to designate bank depositories

Aansas, 1955, the board of bounty commissioners is given authority to designate cank depositories for public funds providing said banks give a good and sufficient bond, and WHEREAS, it is provided that in lieu of the giving of such bond, said depository banks may deposit with the governing body, security as set out in the law, to the emount of seventy per

may deposit with the governing only, security as set out in die inw, to the amount of sevency per cent (70%) of the amount which may be on deposit therein by the county at any one time, and WHEREAS, it is further provided that during the periods of peak deposits occuring at tax paying time and tax distributing time and continuing for a period of not to exceed sixty continuous days at any given time, and not to exceed one hundred and twenty days in any calondar year, the amount of all depository bonds given to secure public deposits shall be reduced in amount by oneamount of all depository bonds given to secure public deposits shall be reduced in amount by one-halfthereof; that is, during such sixty-day period the personal surety bond need only equal in amount the total deposits at any such time and the corporato surety bond need be only fifty per cent (50%) in amount of the total deposits at any such time; and that other security as set out by law, need be only fifty per cent (50%) in amount of the total deposits at any such time, and WHERAS, the Statutes provides that no bonds for security be required when such deposit is covered by insurance under provisions of the federal deposit insurance fund of the federal

deposit insurance corporation.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, State of Kansas, in regular adjourned session this 24th day of October, 1945, that the following named banks insured under the F. D. I. C. be designated as depositories of public funds: The Lawrence National Bank Lawrence, Kansas Lawrence, Kansas
