The board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in special session, said meeting being called by the County Clerk, T. R. Gerhart, in compliance with a request from the State Livestock Commission.

M. L. Baker, Deputy Inspector of the State Livestock Commission was present in regard to the rabies quarantine as ordered by the Governor of the State and by the Livestock Commission.

The following resolution was adopted by the Board of County Commissioners, ordering the quarantine of all dogs in the County, for a period of 90 days:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, symptoms of a disease known as RABIES now exists among certain domestic animals within the limits of Douglas County, Kansas, and

WHEREAS, the health and lives of citizens and domestic animals of said area are in danger, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined necessary to prevent the spread of rabies among domestic animals of said area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that all dogs in Douglas County, be quarantined in accordance with the orders and directions of the Governor of the State of Kansas, and of the Livestock Sanitary Commissioner of the State of Kansas; and that the State Livestock Sanitary Commissioner is hereby requested to put said quarantine into effect in Douglas County, Kansas.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the governing bodies of all towns and communities in Douglas County, be and are hereby requested to cooperate in the enforcement of any quarantine orders issued by the State Livestock Sanitary Commissioner.
