Douglas County Republican, Lawrence

February 13, 1946

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the board being present.

Sheriff R. Skinner presented Archie Dumas whom he suggested be appointed Special Deputy for 90 days to enforce the quarantine resolution as adopted on February 8th. After considerable discussion the Sheriff was authorized to place Archie Dumas on his payroll for the next 90 days at \$125. a month, the County to furnish Mr. Dumas with a truck equipped to be used as a dog catcher. Sheriff Skinner and Mr. Dumas were instructed to contact Dr. J. M. Mott and Lawrence Chief of Police Bliesner as to the disposal of the dogs.

Ogden Jones, and George Hedrick of the Chamber of Commerce appeared before the board for additional discussion of the enumeration and census of the City. No action was taken.

Fritz Meyn appeared before the board, bringing with him Deputy Assessor, W.S. Robb. Mr. Meyn complained that he had been doubly assessed on some household items which were in Mr. Robb's territory, being located at 937 Missouri, and which were being used by his daughter, Mrs. Fritz Lewis. A portion of the items in dispute belonged to another daughter, Mrs. Alice Marie Smart. After some discussion the County Commissioners issued the following orders:

Order No. 410. Reduce the following personal property tax on the 1945 personal tax roll in the City of Lawrence, assessed to George Dobbs, 1220 Tennessee, Lawrence, Kansas. Reduce intangible property from \$1500.00 to \$1440., thereby reducing the tax from \$7.50 to \$7.20. The full constitutional exemption was not allowed.

Cancel the following personal property tax on the 1945 tax roll in the City of Lawrence: Alice Marie Smart, Route 1, Lawrence. Statement #3785. Prop @ 937 Missouri. Tangible Value \$30. Tangible Tax \$1.03. Claims double assessment.

Order No. 411: Cancel the following personal property on the 1945 tax roll in North Lawrence, assessed to Charles Fowler, 745 Grant, Lawrence. 1 dog \$2.00. The dog is a seeing-eye dog and as such should not have been taxed.

Cancel the following personal property tax on the 1945 tax roll in the City of Lawrence: Fritz Meyn, Route 1, Lawrence, Kansas. Statement #2686. Prop @ 937 Missouri. Tangible Value \$70. Tangible Tax \$2.40. Claims double assessment.

The following deputy assessors were approved and appointed for the 1946, this being the year for real estate assessment additional assessors are needed.
