The petition of Herbert Olmsted for a sewer on Louisiana Street was presented and continued until the next meeting for discussion and action.

The salary of the janitor, Harold Wilburn, was discussed and upon proper motion, second and vote, his monthly salary was increased to \$140.00 beginning as of July 1, 1946.

Dick Treese, the Veteran's Housing administrator from the University was present to discuss the county health unit, and the proposed 1/2 mill levy for the health department.

No further business, the board adjourned to meet July 6th.

It was moved by Mr. Penny that the City under the direction of its Engineer, shall construct a sanitary sewer or sewers across Louisiana Street between 20th and 23rd Streets, at a price not to exceed \$250. Mr. Johnson seconded the motion and on vote called, the motion carried.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the board being present.

Additional bills for services and supplies were approved and allowed as per the Allowance Record.

The issuance of Temporary Notes pending the completion of the improvement on Louisiana Street and Haskell Avenue was discussed, and the following resolutions were adopted authorizing the issuance of temporary notes for the two projects.

Resolution

WHEREAS, resolutions have heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, for the improvement of Louisiana Street from Nineteenth (19th) Street to Twenty-third (23rd) Street, and a highway adjoining, in the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas, by paving, grading, curbing and drainage of said street, under the provisions of Sections 12-647 to 12-655b inclusive, of the General Statutes of Kansas, 1935, and

WHEREAS, the plans, specifications and estimates for said project were submitted to the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, and the City Council of the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas, in joint session, and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary for said Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, State of Kansas, to secure funds to pay for its proportionate share in furnishing materials and other items for the improvement of said street, and

WHEREAS, it appears that the share of the cost of improving said street, to be paid by The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, is the sum of \$20,074.60, including the 20% proportion to be paid by the property owners as provided in Section 12-647 to 12-655b of the General Statutes of Kansas, 1935.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, issue and sell temporary notes under the authority of the General Statutes of Kansas, 1935, Section 10-123, in the aggregate sum of \$20,074.60, for the purpose of obtaining money to pay its proportionate share for the improvement of said street.

That said temporary notes be numbered one to twenty-one consecutively, twenty of said notes to be in the denomination of \$1000.00 each, and one note in the amount of \$74.60; that said notes be payable to bearer; that said notes be dated the 10th day of July, 1946; that said notes be due
