The Sheriff's office was given permission to install a sink in the County jail at a cost of \$114.50, not including installation.

A Resolution to sell the Douglas County Farm was approved by the Board of County Commissioners and adopted as follows:

Resolution

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Farm has been discontinued and to the best interests of Douglas County, Kansas, to sell, as provided by Section 19-211/of the General Statutes of Kansas for 1935, real estate owned and in the possession of said County, described as follows: said county farm

"The Northwest Quarter (NTA) of Section Twenty (20), in Township Thirteen (13), Range Twenty (20), containing 160 acres, more or less, in Douglas County, Kansas;

and

All that portion of the West One-Half  $(W_2^1)$  of the Southwest Guarter  $(SW_4^1)$ , of Section Seventeen (17), in Township Thirteen (13), Rarge Twenty (20), lying South of the Wakarusa Creek and containing 15½ acres, more or less, in Douglas County, Kansas.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, further finds the value of the above-described real property is more than Five Thousand Dollars, (\$5,000.00).

NCW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session, assembled this 24th day of September, 1946, that the proposition of selling the above-described real property be submitted to a vote of the electors of Douglas County, Kansas, at the next general election, in said County, Kansas, said general election to be held November 5, 1946, as provided by law.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, Commissioners L. H. Griffith and Ed Johnson being present, Emil W. Heck being out of town.

Regular monthly claims for payroll, services and supplies were approved and allowed as per the Allowance Record.

A petition signed by Carl C. Perkins, P. J. Neis and John Schopper, owners of the real estate described was presented, requesting the Board to vacate and exclude from the boundaries of Eudora City the following described property towit:

"All blocks, lots, streets, alleys and other land which lies within the City of Eudora, and is located South of the Kansas River and North of Wakarusa River and west from where said two rivers join, the west line of said tract being the west line of the city limits of Eudora, Douglas County, Kansas.

Said property being otherwise described as blocks 66 to 70 inclusive, 100 to 105 inclusive, blocks 138 to 141 inclusive, blocks 174 to 176 inclusive, blocks 210 and 211; streets B to I inclusive and First Street to Fourth Street inclusive".

The petition was referred to the County Attorney for recommendations.

The County Clerk presented the distribution of the election expenses for the Primary Election held on August 6, 1946, which were approved by the Board and County Commissioners Order No.425 was issued as follows:

Order No. 425:

To charge the general fund of the respective townships and the City of Lawrence, in the amounts as indicated balow to cover their proportionate share of the 1946 Primary Election estimates, and to credit the County General Fund with the total amount of \$1947.24.
