The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met Tuesday according to law to canvass the In-State Absentee Ballots, all members of the Board being present.

Of the 51 ballots returned to the County Clerk, two were by non-registered voters, and one the ballot was disqualified because the affidavit had not been signed by election judges. No change was made in the final election count.

Additional bills for services and supplies were approved and allowed as per the Allowance Record.

H. D. Thomas, auctioneer, made a bid to the Board on the sale of the County Farm of 1% on personal property on the farm. No decision was reached, bid to be held open for further consideration.

The Board authorized E. E. Larson, County Engineer, to select storage space to store the belongings the County wished to retain in the sale of the County Farm.

The Board instructed County Attorney Bob Oyler to start any legal proceedings in connection with the disposal of the farm.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet November 16, 1946.

Cancellation Orders Nos. 435, 435A, 436, 437, 438, 439, 440, 441, 442, 443, and 444 were approved and issued.

The following resolution was approved by the Board vacating McNeil Avenue, Hosford Avenue, McQuary Avenue, and Sutton Blvd:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, unanimously finds that it would be to the best interests of Douglas County, Kansas, to vacate the following streets, avenues and boulevards which are as follows:

McNeil Avenue, Hosford Avenue,
McQuary Avenue and Sutton Boulevard;

said roads, streets, avenues and boulevards having been made a part of an addition to the City of Lawrence, Kansas, known as South Ridge Addition. Said addition being located in Douglas County, Kansas, and a plat of said South Ridge being recorded in Plat Book 3 at Page 19 in the Register of Deeds Office of Douglas County, Kansas, at Lawrence, Kansas. Said roads, streets, avenues and boulevards being in and upon the following described property as shown by said plat as above stated, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southeast (SE) corner of Section Six (6), Township Thirteen South (13S), Range Nineteen East (19E), thence North (N) along the line between Range Nineteen East (19E) and Range Twenty East (20E) 998.0 feet; thence Southeasterly at an angle of 90 degrees and 40 minutes 648.0 feet; thence due South (S) 995.3 feet; thence Northeasterly at an angle of 90 degrees and 22 minutes
