The meeting to discuss recommended legislation with local legislators was called by L. H. Griffith, Chairman of the Board of Douglas County Commissioners, at 10:30 a.m. on January 2, 1947, at the office of the County Commissioners in Lawrence, Kansas.

Present for the meeting were the following legislators: James F. Swoyer of the 5th Senatorial District; Thomas B. Wilson of the 4th Representative District; Charles Stough of the 11th Representative District; and Edwin F. Abels of the 12th Representative District. Jefferson County was represented by County Commissioners, W. W. Dettlor and Guy Shultz, and Welfare Director, Jean Helen Clark. Douglas County was represented by Commissioners L. H. Griffith, Ed Johnson, and Emil W. Heck; Commissioner-elect E. W. Cusdahl; County Engineer, Emil Larson; Welfare Director, Mildred D. Watson; County Attorney, Robert B. Oyler; and Mildred Le Suer, Accountant.

The agenda for the morning session included the introduction and detailed discussion of desirable legislation in the general fields of Roads, Welfare, Finance, and Education. In the afternoon session, specific recommendations growing out of the morning's program, were formulated for presentation to the legislators, a list of which is to be found in the Douglas County Commissioners file in the office of the County Clerk.

## RESOLUTION

### RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE INCLUSION OF COUNTY ROADS IN THE FEDERAL SECONDARY ROAD SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, all members present, finds it expedient to designate the whole of the county road system as a part of the federal secondary road system;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the remainder of the county roads, which are not now included in the federal secondary system, be and are hereby designated as federal secondary roads.
