## January 15, 1947.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members being present.

This being the first moeting day of the new term the Board decided it was the proper time to reorganize. It was moved, seconded, and on vote called the motion carried that L. H. Griffith remain Chairman, and Ed Johnson remain Vice-Chairman of the Board for 19478. Elmer W. Cusdahl is the new commissioner for the First District.

The motion was moved by Ed Johnson, and seconded by Elmer W. Cusdahl, and upon vote being called the motion carried, that the salary of County Attorney Robert B. Oyler be increased \$50.00 (fifty dollars) per month until an assistant is appointed according to Statute 28-158, Kansas Statutes for 1945, beginning January 1, 1947.

The printing contracts for 1947 were discussed. It was decided by the Board, upon proper motion, second and vote, that the bills allowed shall be published in the Lawrence Daily Journal-World as in 1946 @  $7\frac{1}{2}\phi$  a line, the Outlook shall be published in the Lawrence Daily Journal-World as in 1946 @  $7\frac{1}{2}\phi$  a line, the Outlook shall publish the delinquent tax list, and the Baldwin Ledger shall publish all legal notices and the judicial tax sale notice, each at the same rate as in 1946, the Outlook @ 20¢ per description and 9¢ per town lot, the Baldwin Ledger © 79¢ per square, 20¢ per description and 9¢ per town lot.
