The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session February 15, 1947.

Roy Flory, County Treasurer, appeared before the Board to inquire about the disposition of the proceeds of the Douglas County farm sale. He was told to place the money in a special fund known as the County Home Improvement Fund.

E. E. Larson, County Engineer, reported \$150 per acre as the appraised value set by the Board of Appraisers for allowing damages to those affected by the Eudora Road.

The Board will meet with the Leavenworth County Commissioners at the Eudora Bridge over the Kaw River on Wednesday, the 19th of February at 2 o'clock p.m.

T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk, read the minutes of the previous meeting and same were approved by the Board.

Mr. Dumas appeared before the Board to suggest that the County buy fire extinguishers for the various county offices. Six (6) extinguishers were ordered at a cost of \$6.50 each.

Will Johns Jr., Sheriff, reported that a camera for his office use would cost \$200.00. The Board deferred the purchase of said equipment.

Dr. Mott presented a bid of \$25 per month by the Ragan Exterminators of Kansas City to eradicate the vermin from the sheriff's residence and the county jail. This bid was referred to the County Attorney, R. B. Oyler, for study and with the authorization to write to the above mentioned firm for further details.

The Board accepted the bid by Owen Mitchell of nineteen cents (19¢) per cubic yard for excavation of a new channel on Mud Creek, exact location as follows:

In N E Corner of Section 17, Range 20, Township 12 in Grant Township on University of Kansas property.

Mr. Mitchell's bid also included a charge of twenty cents (20¢) per cubic yard for placing dirt on the Township road on each side of bridge at the location of the channel change, for which the township is to pay.

The Board adjourned to meet February 19, 1947.
