A copy of the above claims was sent to the Eudora Township Board.

A representative of the Martin Tractor Company appeared and offered to sell a 3/4 yard shovel to be delivered on or about July 1st, 1947. He discussed prices and agreed to accept the old shovel in trade, however, the Board did not reach a decision on this matter at this time.

In the afternoon, the Board of Commissioners of Douglas County met with the Board of Commissioners of Leavenworth County at the Eudora Bridge, where it was agreed to place runway plank on the approach to the bridge over the Kaw River, and to place forty (40) units of steel jetties at \$31.38 per unit, both counties to share the material and labor cost equally.

After the Board returned to their office, Henry Asher, Attorney, appeared before them representing Scott R. Holloway Estate in reference to a mistaken payment of interest on a tax judgment. This matter was referred to the County Attorney, R. B. Oyler, who advised the Board to disallow the claim, said action being taken by the Board.

Mr. Joe Chrisman from Cerophyl Laboratories, Inc., appeared asking for the privilege of laying a gas line along the county road right of way in the vicinity of Lake View. This request was referred to the County Attorney, Robert B. Oyler.

Everett Pence, James A. Wright, J. P. Clevenger, W. E. Hoskinson, F. M. Raymond, and Mrs. Homes Terry were appointed as additional 1947 Deputy Assessors for Douglas County.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet February 24, 1947.

Harold Beck, Register of Deeds, requested the privilege of procuring hand towels for his office at \$1.50 per month, and request was granted.

The Board met Monday evening, February 24, 1947, with the Mayor of Lawrence, and the City Councilmen, according to law, for a hearing on the valuation and assessment of the property on the county side of the Louisiana Street Paving project. No complaints were made.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet Thursday, February 27. The Board is to go to Chanute Wednesday morning to view the 3/4 yard power shovel offered by the Martin Tractor Company.
