March 17, 1947.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members being present.

The Board met with the Welfare Department as a Welfare Board in the morning.

Additional bills for equipment and supplies were approved and allowed by the Board.

The petition for a road to be opened in Kanwaka Township was rejected by unanimous action of the Board. The petition, signed by T. F. Connole and seventeen others, was presented to the Board praying for the location of a road in said county described as follows:

"Beginning at a point $\frac{1}{2}$ mile South of the N. W. corner of Section #1, Township #13S, Range #17E; thence East $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to intersect with the present County Road $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles South of Stull, all in Kanwaka Township."

The Board met at 2:00 o'clock on March 17, 1947 at the place of beginning, and acting as a Board of Viewers, and accompanied by the County Surveyor, proceeded to view and give all persons a hearing.

A representative of Newlin-Mossbacher called to discuss the purchase of a shovel by the County priced at \$11,349.00 f.o.b. Milwaukee.

A representative for the NorthWestern Company appeared in behalf of Funkhouser Machinery Company, and priced a $\frac{3}{4}$ yard NorthWestern shovel priced at \$11,779.87 f.o.b. Green Bay, Wisconsin.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet March 22, 1947.
