April 14, 1947.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members being present.

A committee from the Lone Star Lake Association appeared to discuss the improvement of the Lake and the proper procedure for the sale of lots. The County has sold all the lots and anyone wanting to purchase lots now will have to get information about them through George Hedrick, Secretary of the Lawrence Chamber of Commerce.

County Engineer E. E. Larson was authorized to improve the road from Highway 59—three and one-half (3½) miles west; five-eighths (5/8) of a mile in Palmyra Township connecting High Street in Baldwin, Kansas, with a stabilized rock base, with Highway 50 to the East; and one (1) mile of County road in Grant Township, said work to be done as a Federal Highway project. The County Engineer was also authorized to take over and improve the road known as the Deemer road; and a road north of Lone Star connecting the Lawrence-Lone Star road with the Globe-Clinton road.

The Medical Association met to discuss the working of the medical services for the relief clients. It was agreed to add some amendments to the contract between the Medical Association and the County.

It was agreed by the Board that they would not pay over one hundred (100) dollars per month for a Tax-Collector in the Sheriff's Office.

By proper motion, second, and vote it was agreed that a pick-up truck be fitted with a flat bottom, and transferred to the Lone Star Lake Park at a cost of one hundred (100) dollars.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet Wednesday, April 16th.
