

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

April 16, 1947.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members being present.

County Sheriff Will Johns, Jr., appeared in regard to the filling of the office tax-collector. He was informed that he would be permitted to pay up to one hundred (100) dollars per month.

Sealed bids for two trucks were opened at ten o'clock. By proper motion, second, and vote, the bid of Orville Ray of three hundred and five (305.00) dollars cash for Dodge Truck #5 was accepted, and the bid of Morgan Mack of one-hundred (100) dollars for Dodge Truck #4 was rejected. The bid of Orville Ray of one hundred (100) dollars for Dodge Truck 1A was accepted.

County Engineer E. E. Larson was ordered to gravel an entrance to the west side of the Convalescent home for the entrance and exit of vehicles, and the drive on the east of the building. He was also ordered to place a hand rail on the front step and a hand rail on the west ramp.

County Treasurer Roy Flory appeared before the Board with a request for a sign for his office. The request was granted and he was instructed to secure the same.

By proper motion, second, and vote, it was agreed to reappoint Arthur Heck, Route 3, Lawrence, Kansas, a member of School Reorganization Committee as of April 21, 1947.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet April 19th.
