

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD N

June 28, 1947.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members being present.

E. E. Larson, County Engineer, reported on the meeting with Mr. Sunderland of the Water Resources Board, and interested persons at the head-end of Coal Creek to discuss the proposed changing of the channel. No action was taken at the meeting at Coal Creek.

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

County Engineer E. E. Larson requested a \$5.00 per month increase in the wages of the men under the direction of the engineer. The raise was given to those who are employed on outside work. The blacksmith at the yards, Bill Tucker, also received the \$5.00 raise, and W. N. Stevens received the regular semi-annual \$5.00 raise.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet July 1, 1947, to sign the payroll checks.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

The Board appointed James Postma as Assistant County Attorney, said Mr. Postma to be paid on the basis of ten per cent (10%) of the County Attorney's salary, or a salary of one hundred twenty dollars and seventy five cents a month (\$120.75), effective as of July 15, 1947.

County Engineer E. E. Larson was ordered to close the road east $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles on S23, T15S, R20E.

The monthly payroll was approved and allowed as per the Allowance Record.

The motion was made by Commissioner Ed Johnson, seconded by Elmer W. Cusdahl, and on vote being called, passed, that the committee who were appointed to beautify and develop the Lone Star Lake and Park shall have power to proceed on their own initiative and the county will bear any expense incurred up to \$50.00.

The personal property assessment of Wilson Orender, 1145 New York, Lawrence, was reduced \$100.00 on furniture due to an erroneous assessment.

The Beer Application of Velma V. Dillon, 1112 Delaware Street, for Dillon's Cafe, in Grant Township, was approved and issued by the Board as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, ON THE 5th day of July, 1947, the same being a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, the application of Velma V. Dillon for a beer license came on for the consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board does find that the said Velma V. Dillon, is in all ways qualified under the law to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on the premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that due and legal notice has been given to the Grant Township Board and that ten days have expired from the giving of said notice, and that no written objection has been filed by the Grant Township Board, protesting the granting of a beer license,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by said Board, that the applicant Velma V. Dillon be granted a license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises at the place so described in application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk of Douglas County, be and he is hereby directed to issue said license.
