RESOLUTION

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Resolution relating to the sale of Improvement Bonds dated September 15, 1947.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, did on the 27th day of August, 1947, pass a resolution providing for the issuing of Improvement Bonds in the amount of \$7,846.64 for the grading, curbing, and paving of Louisiana Street from 19th Street to 23rd Street in the City of Lawrence, Kansas, said bonds to be dated September 15, 1947, said bonds to be numbered from one to sixteen inclusive and said bonds to bear interest at the rate of 1½ per cent per annum.

WHEREAS, SAID Board finds that the Lawrence National Bank of Lawrence, Kansas, and the First National Bank of Lawrence, Kansas, jointly desires to purchase said bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that Improvement Bonds dated September 15, 1947, in the amount of \$7,846.64 bearing interest at the rate of 1½ per cent per annum, be sold to the Lawrence National Bank of Lawrence, Kansas, and the First National Bank of Lawrence, Kansas.
