(10) Provided however that in case of irregularities or in case the auditors are requested to prepare statements for civil recovery or criminal prosecution or to appear before any court or tribunal for any hearing growing out of this audit contract the auditors shall be compensated for such additional service at the rate of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per day of 8 hours plus the necessary living and traveling expenses while out of the office at Topeka, Kansas.

October 1, 1947.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular session, all members of the Board being present, to sign the payroll.

Bindweed Supervisor, Ebon Anderson, was authorized by the Board to purchase some liquid weed killer.

The Board agreed to employ Miss Edna Burkwall as Superintendent of the Convalescent Hospital providing a satisfactory contract can be arranged.

Carl H. White was employed by the Board to care for the furnace at the Convalescent Hospital at a salary of \$20.00 per month, to begin when called by either the Superintendent of the Home, the County Commissioners, or Mrs. Watson.

An agreement was entered into by the Board as of this date with the Central West Utility Company, of Kansas City, Missouri, for the rental on the use of the Warren Truss Steel Bridge across the Wakarusa River at Eudora, Kansas. The Central West Utility Company agrees to pay rent by the year for the use of the bridge in laying a three inch pipeline, rental to start as of October 1, 1947, said Agreement being on file in the County Clerks Office.

The hearing on the Douglas County Kaw Drainage District was held in the room of the Board of County Commissioners, at 2 o'clock, P.M., according to the Notice of Hearing first published in the Lawrence Daily Journal-World September 24, 1947. Those present were L. H. Griffith, Chairman; Ed Johnson, Commissioner; Elmer W. Cusdahl, Commissioner; Robert B. Oyler, Attorney for County Commissioners; J. B. Wilson, attorney for the Drainage Board; Charles A. Springer, attorney for Seymour Gentry and Bertha B. Gentry; Forrest A. Jackson, attorney for all other petitioners; and other petitioners present being Emma K. Koving; Frederick Bartz; Michael Schutz, and Lydia E. Schutz, his wife; and Mary B. Farley.

J. B. Wilson, attorney, representing the Drainage Board, brought up the point the name filed in the petition was not the same as that on record in the county clerks office, that on the petition being the Kaw Valley Drainage District. Mr. Wilson recommended the petition be thrown out as no amendment may be added, and a new petition filed by the petitioners with Mr. Jackson. Bob Oyler, attorney for the Commissioners, recommended this procedure be followed. Charles Springer, attorney for Seymour Gentry and wife, suggested another petition be filed and another notice started. Mr. Wilson said there was no hurry, just so the records are straight by March 1, 1948. Mrs. Ben Koving wants the matter settled right now. Mr. Jackson left the plat of Douglas County Kaw Drainage District with the Commissioners. Mr. Oyler told the group the Commissioners had ten days after the next hearing to make a decision on the matter.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet Saturday, October 4, 1947.
