The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

The Board accepted the bid of Willard Cobb, Overbrook, Kansas, of \$285.00, for one 1938 Chevrolet one-half ton pickup truck from the Road and Bridge Department.

The Board met to consider the petition to create a sanitary sewer, presented by Fred W. and Alice Johnson, owners of the property described in the petition. The Board agreed to grant the petition, and the following motion was passed by the Board. Also, the following resolution was submitted to the Mayor and the City Councilmen of the City of Lawrence, asking their approval to fasten on to the City line at 17th and Barker Sts:

## MOTION

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, meeting in regular session on this 21st day of February, 1948, all members being present, a petition signed by Fred W. and Alice Johnson was presented to the Board requesting that the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, create a sanitary sewer district embracing the property as described in said petition wherein said district would connect with the Lawrence Sanitary Sewer District on Barker Street at approximately 17th Street in the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas.

It is moved by Mr. L. H. Griffith that the County Commissioners accept the sewer petition and employ Clifford Harper, City Engineer, to proceed with plans and specifications, and to prepare the matter for contract, provided the City of Lawrence will approve the connection on the city sewer. Mr. Ousdahl seconded the motion and on a vote the motion was carried unanimously.

It is further moved by Mr. Griffith, that Douglas County petition the City of Lawrence to connect the proposed sewer on the city sewer at approximately 17th Street and Barker Street in Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas. Mr. Ousdahl seconded the motion and on a vote the motion was carried unanimously.
