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*Petition to Douglas County School District #19*

The Board met at 10:00 o'clock A. M. to consider the repeal of the decision of the County Superintendent in the matter of the petition to the County Superintendent to transfer designated lands from School District No. 19, Young District in Lecompton Township, to School District No. 36, City of Lecompton. Those present were: The Board of County Commissioners, represented by Ed Johnson, Chairman, and L. H. Griffith, Commissioner; Olin Petefish, attorney for School District No. 19, that portion filing the petition; Jas. L. Postma, Assistant County Attorney; Mrs. Margaret Hurley, County Superintendent of Douglas County Schools; and the three board members of District No. 19. The petitioners were; Mr. & Mrs. Pete Bahnmaier; Mr. and Mrs. C. A. Dittrich; Charles Paslay; E. J. Walter; Mr. & Mrs. Frank Walter; Mr. & Mrs. Sam Dirk, who were all present. Edward T. Riling, Jr., attorney for rest of School District 19.

After considerable discussion the Board decided by motion to uphold County Superintendent Hurley's ruling denying the petition that land be detached from Young district in Lecompton Township, School District No. 19, and annexed to Lecompton City or School District No. 36.

The Board met at 11:00 o'clock A. M. to consider the appeal to the Board by the members of the school board of Burnette district, or School District No. 62, said members being Albert C. Schuake, W. A. Cusdahl, and Robert Simmons, asking the Board to reverse the decision of the County Superintendent to detach about seventeen acres from No. 61, White School District, and annex said acreage to No. 62, Burnette District, in Grant Township. Those present were: The Board of County Commissioners represented by Ed Johnson, Chairman, and L. H. Griffith, Commissioner; White School District No. 61 Board members, Raymond Pine, H. C. Stuart and Emil W. Heck, Jr; Burnette School District No. 62 Board members, Albert C. Schuake, W. A. Cusdahl, and Robert Simmons; Jas. L. Postma, Assistant County Attorney; Mrs. Margaret Hurley, County Superintendent.

After considerable discussion, the Board decided by motion to overrule Mrs. Hurley's decision to allow the said acreage to be detached from No. 61 and annexed to No. 62.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet Monday, March 1, 1948.
