Commissioners Cancellation Order No. 520 was approved by the Board.

A resolution was signed whereby the county elects to come within the provisions of the workmen's Compensation laws of the State of Kansas as pertains to the employees of the Road and Bridge Department of Douglas County, resolution as follows:

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, finds that it would be advantageous to file an election with the Workmen's Compensation Commissioner of the State of Kansas whereby said County elects to come within the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation laws of the State of Kansas as pertains to the employees of the Road and Bridge Department of Douglas County, Kansas.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular session assembled this 5th day of April, 1948, that the Board of County Commissioners electe to file written application with the Workmen's Compensation Commissioner of the State of Kansas in regard to Workmen's Compensation laws of the State of Kansas as pertains to the Road and Bridge Department of Douglas County, Kansas; and it is further resolved and ordered that all procedural steps required to effect this order be complied with by the said Douglas County, Kansas; and that a written statement of this election be sent for thwith to the Workmen's Compensation Commissioner.

A contract was signed with Calvin Boatman to be superintendent of Lone Star Lake for two years, from April 5, 1943, and ending on April 5, 1950, contract as follows:

### CONTRACT

This contract, made and entered into on this 5th day of April, 1948, by and between the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, parties of the first part, and Calvin F. Boatman, party of the second part:

WITMESSETH: That the parties of the first part, in consideration of the rents, covenants, and agreements of the party of the second part, hereinafter set forth, do by these presents let, lease; and rent to the said party of the second part, for the period of two years (2), beginning April 5,1948, and ending on April 5th, 1950, the following described property, to-wit:

Building No. 5 at Lore Star Park for the Purpose of operating a cafe selling food, soft drinks, cigarettes, and cigars in said building.

Parties of the first part extend to the party of the second part the exclusive right to sell fish bait within the park boundaries, and the exclusive right to rent boats which the party of the second part shall own and must keep painted and in sanitary condition.

Party of the second part shall be furnished one of the dwellings in the park for his private use. Party of the second part shall pay the gas bill for his personal use as well as for concession use, but he shall have the privilege of using the gas range owned by the County for use in the concession building, Building No. 5.

In lieu of rent for his house and for the concession building, and for other privileges herein granted, party of the second part shall act as superintendent of the Lone Star Lake and Park, under jurisdiction of the Board of Governors, and shall police said Lake and Park to see that no ore fishes without having both State and County fishing licenses. Party of the second part shall receive a 10% commission of said monies collected from sale of said above mentioned licenses.

Party of the second part shall be furnished with a park maintenance staff which shall be designated in numbers and salaries by the parties of the first part, and said party of the second part shall engineer the remodeling, painting, and all construction work in the Park with the assistance and advice of the County Engineer.

Parties of the first part shall furnish the party of the second part a motor boat to be used for the purpose of patrolling said lake. Under no condition shall such boat be rented or used for pay
