The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

Additional bills for equipment and supplies were approved and allowed by the Board as per the Allowance Record.

The Board met by appointment at 10:00 o'clock A. M. Monday, May 3rd, with the representatives from the Wellsville School Board, the purpose of the meeting to discuss the possibility of including certain territories in Douglas County in a Wellsville Rural High School District under consideration by the Wellsville School Board at this time. Those present were: Lowell Collins, President of the Board of Education of Wellsville, and R. D. O'Neill, past-president of the Board of Education of Wellsville; The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Ed Johnson, Chairman; Elmer W. Ousdahl, Commissioner, and L. H. Griffith, Commissioner; Mrs. Mildred LeSuer, Budget Director.

After considerable discussion, the Board was advised by Mrs. LeSuer, quoting from the 1947 Supplement to General Statutes of Kansas of 1935, that 2/5 of the signers of voters can petition, asking for the organization of the district, with the largest territory calling for special election, and in this case, Franklin County will have the largest territory, therefore, it is up to them to initiate proceedings.
