

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD O

23

August 16, 1948.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, Ed Johnson and L. H. Griffith being present.

The Board met by appointment at 11:00 o'clock A. M. to determine the outcome of the nomination of the Primary Election held on August 3, 1948, said nomination ending in a tie between J.B. Wilson and Theodore A. Kennedy for Precinct Committeemen for the First Precinct of the Second Ward. Those present were: The Board of County Commissioners represented by Ed Johnson, Chairman, and L.H. Griffith, Member; J. B. Wilson; County Attorney Robert B. Oyler; County Clerk T. R. Gerhart; Dorothy Goodrick Secretary; Mrs. Betty Abels, reporter for the Outlook.

The County Attorney suggested to the Commissioners a toss of the coin be used to determine the nomination, the picture of the woman be used as heads, and the eagle to be used as tails, said suggestion being approved by the Board, Mr. Wilson, and County Clerk T. R. Gerhart. Mr. Griffith wrote on a slip of paper the names of Mr. Wilson and Mr. Kennedy opposite the words heads and tails respectively. Mr. Johnson flipped the half-dollar coin, Mr. Griffith checked it before the County Attorney, then the County Attorney read off tails, or the eagle side, as being up. The Commissioners secretary, Dorothy Goodrick, held the slip of paper designating heads or tails, and read the name of Kennedy as following tails, all at the direction of the County Attorney. The County Attorney then declared Theodore A. Kennedy as having won the toss-up for nomination for precinct committeemen. Mr. Wilson, the Commissioners, and the County Clerk agreed to the decision.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet Wednesday, August 18, 1948.
