

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD O

October 6, 1948.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

Additional bills for equipment and supplies were approved and allowed by the Board as per the Allowance Record.

Allen French, Auditor, presented to the Board the Audit Agreement for 1948-1949, said agreement being approved and signed by the Board, and on file in the County Clerks Office, said agreement being as follows:

AUDIT AGREEMENT

- (1) THIS AGREEMENT: Made and entered into this 6th day of October, 1948, between Allen French Licensed Municipal Public Accountant of Topeka, Kansas, party of the first part, and the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, party of the second part.
- (2) WITNESSETH: That the party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of money hereinafter stated, agrees to examine by and through his examiners, the official financial records and accounts of the County Commissioners, County Treasurer, County Clerk, Register of Deeds, Clerk of District Court, Probate Judge, Judge of the County Court, Justices of the Peace, Sheriff, County Attorney, County Superintendent, County Engineer, Blindweed Supervisor and Welfare Director, for the period, January 1, 1948, to December 31, 1948.
- (3) Said first party further agrees that, the audit shall be performed in accordance with the general and specific provisions of the Minimum Standard Audit Program approved by the State Municipal Accounting Board, as of October 25, 1940, and subsequent amendments and supplements.
- (4) Said first party also agrees to begin the audit on or about August 1, 1949, and to complete the audit by September 30, 1949.
- (5) The party of the second part hereby agrees to pay the party of the first part for his services Twelve Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00) payable monthly as the work progresses on estimates approved by the County Commissioners, final payment, not less than 33 1/3% of fee, exclusive of travel and subsistence expenses, to be made when the report is accepted by them, and a notice has been received that a copy thereof has been filed with the State Accountant. The County to receive two complete copies of the audit report and each official a copy covering his office.
- (7) Since this Contract covers work to be done in the 1949 budget year the following paragraphs No. 8 and 9 are included, to set up the County's liability as limited by the cash basis and budget laws.
- (8) On January 2, 1949, the party of the second part agrees to issue a purchase order in favor of the party of the first part in the amount of \$1,250.00 which will be charged to the 1949 budget and cash balances of the County General Fund, and which will be payable according to and within the limitations of the sixth paragraph of this agreement.
- (9) Provided however, that where this agreement refers to work to be done during the period January 2, 1949 to September 30, 1949, the agreement shall not be in full force or effect until January 2, 1949.
- (10) Provided however that in case of irregularities or in case the auditors are requested to prepare statements for civil recovery or criminal prosecution or to appear before any court or tribunal for any hearing growing out of this audit contract, the auditors shall be compensated for such additional service at the rate of Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) per day of 8 hours plus the necessary living and traveling expenses while out of the office at Topeka, Kansas.

The Board met as a Board of Road Viewers at 2 o'clock P. M. on the East line of Section 31, Township 11 S, Range 18 E. Those present were the County Surveyor; the Board of County Commissioners represented by Elmer W. Cusdahl, Vice-Chairman, and L. H. Griffith, member. The Lecompton Township Board and the three Road Viewers appointed by the Board did not appear.

The Board decided to designate the road as laid out and used as a private roadway at present, said road to come under the jurisdiction of Lecompton Township as a township road. The description of said road is as follows:

"Beginning at a point 4.57 chains West of the Quarter Corner between Sections 31 and 32 in Township 11 South, Range 18 East, thence West on Quarter Section line to the Northwest Corner of the East half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 31 in Township 11 South, Range 18 East, said Road to be fifty (50) feet in Width."

The Board adjourned to meet Saturday, October 9, 1948.
