The Board met at 9:00 o'clock for the hearings on the petitions for the proposed annexations to the City of Lawrence. Hearing on Exhibit "A", or the territory South of 19th Street and West of Louisiana Street, was held at 9:00 o'clock. The hearing on Exhibit "B", or the territory South of 15th Street and East of Barker Avenue, was held at 10:00 o'clock. Those present were the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Ed Johnson, Chairman, Elmer W. Ousdahl and L. H. Griffith, Commissioners, County Attorney Robert B. Oyler, Assistant County Attorney James Postma, for the County; for the City, City Attorney Charles Stough, Councilman F. A. Russell; Superintendent of Schools E. L. Novotny and the Rev. E. Russell Carter, School Board member; property owners in both districts included in the petitions.

After considerable discussion, the meeting adjourned. The Board announced they would make their decision at a later date.
