

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD O

January 26, 1949.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

Commissioners Cancellation Order No. 553 was approved by the Board.

David D. Beisel appeared before the Board to discuss bindweed on his farm in Wakarusa Township, S11-T13-R19. Weed Supervisor Ebon Anderson was also present. No action was taken at this time.

The Board, along with County Attorney Robert B. Cyler, opened bids at 10:00 o'clock A.M. as advertised for the purchase of real property owned and in possession of Douglas County, excepting all buildings now on said property in the 600 Blocks of New York and Connecticut Streets:

After discussion, the following resolution was passed, whereas the Board unanimously finds that the bid of the Kansas City Coca-Cola Bottling Company, a Corporation, in the amount of \$3500.00 to be the highest:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, have met at regular session on this 26th day of January, 1949, the following Commissioners being present: Chairman, Elmer W. Ousdahl; Commissioner, Charles E. Banning; and Commissioner, Ray C. Ogden.

WHEREAS, bids were open for the purchase of real property owned and in possession of said County, excepting all buildings now on said property, the same being described as follows, to-wit:

Lots 15, 17 and 19 on New York Street in the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas; and

Lots 14, 16, 18 and 20 on Connecticut Street in the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, finds that notice of the sale of said above described property has been given as provided by law and that proof of publication is properly on file in the County Clerk's office of Douglas County, Kansas; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners unanimously finds that the bid of The Kansas City Coca-Cola Bottling Company, a Corporation, in the amount of \$3500.00 for said above described real property is the highest and best bid obtainable for said property and said bid should be accepted by Douglas County, Kansas, for said above described real property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the bid of The Kansas City Coca-Cola Bottling Company, a Corporation, for the above described real property in the amount of \$3500.00 be accepted, and that a Warranty Deed conveying good title be made, executed and delivered to said corporation by said County, transferring the above described real property to the Kansas City Coca-Cola Bottling Company, a Corporation, upon the payment of the sum of \$3500.00 of which \$350.00 has been received, and said conveyance being subject to the option of said County to repurchase said property as provided by the bid of said corporation.
