The following resolution was passed by the Board, giving the City of Lawrence permission to connect a sewer to lateral 5-B of Douglas County Sewer District Number One, said lateral being in University Heights, Part Three: sewer District Number 8:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, have met in regular session this 26th day of February, 1949, the following Commissioners being present: Chairman Elmer W. Ousdahl, Commissioner Charles E. Banning, Commissioner Ray C. Ogden.

WHEREAS, the City of Lawrence, Kansas, has made a request to said Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, for permission to connect a sewer to lateral 5-B of Douglas County Sewer District Number One, said lateral being in what was formerly known as University Heights, Part Three, which is immediately west of the city limits of Lawrence, Kansas; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lawrence, Kansas, request said connection for the purpose of constructing a sanitary sewer to serve Block Three in West Hills, an addition to the City of Lawrence, Kansas; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners unanimously finds that the construction of said connection is to the best interest of Douglas County, Kansas, and that permission to construct said connection should be given.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the City of Lawrence, Kansas, have, and it is hereby granted permission to connect a sanitary sewer to lateral 5-B of Douglas County Sewer District Number One, said connection to be at the expense of the City of Lawrence, Kansas.
