

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD O

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June 8, 1949.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

The Board received a petition, on file in County Clerks office, requesting the Board to detach the property of Melvin E. Holmes, Mrs. Ada Moore, and Max B. Moore from Hopewell School District No. 7 and attach the same to the Vinland Grade School, No. 88. The petitions on the above listed property of Melvin Holmes and Mrs. Ada Moore were denied by the County Superintendent because the detachment of this property from School District No. 7 would reduce the school population to less than 15, at a hearing on May 9, 1949. The Board granted the petition, resolution to be written if and when the approval of one of the property owners can be obtained for the 40 acre tract that would otherwise be excluded from School District No. 7, for it would not join the district in any way.

L. L. Kindred, President Mrs. Rice, Mr. Clawson and Mr. Nehrbrass of the Douglas County Farm Bureau appeared before the Board for the Farm Bureau on the hearing for the 1950 Farm Bureau Budget.

Additional bills for equipment and supplies were approved and allowed by the Board as per the Allowance Record.

Welfare Director Mildred Watson appeared before the Board to discuss Welfare matters.

The following beer license was granted by the Board to Lois F. Moorman to sell beer at "Alice & Lois Cafe", in Wakarusa Township:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 6th day of June, 1949, the same being a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, of Douglas County, the application of Lois F. Moorman, for a beer license came on for consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board does find that the said Lois F. Moorman is in all ways qualified under the law to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on the premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that due and legal notice has been given to the Wakarusa Township Board and that ten days have expired from the giving of said notice, and that no written objection has been filed by the Wakarusa Township Board, protesting the granting of a beer license.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the applicant, Lois F. Moorman be granted a license to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on premises at the place so described in application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT T. R. Gerhart, County Clerk of Douglas County be and he is hereby directed to issue said license.
