The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

Additional bills for equipment and supplies were approved and allowed by the Board as per the Allowance Record.

The Board discussed the new county shop building, located on the new county grounds in Section 7, Township 13, Range 20, with the County Engineer J. I. Rice.

Members of the Board, with other county officials, attended the funeral of Mrs. Means, wife of the District Judge Hugh Means. Courthouse closed during funeral.

Lewis D. Stone, of the Road & Bridge Department, was granted the automatic five dollar raise from \$155.00 to \$160.00 as of October 1, 1949.

Melvin Miller, County Treasurer, appeared before the Board with salary changes in the county treasurers office: Mrs. W. E. Eudaly appointed as Deputy Treasurer with salary of \$160.00 per month; Mrs. Bess Cooke, salary \$145.00 month; O. L. Adams, salary \$145.00 month, as of October 11, 1949.

The Board adjourned to meet Saturday, October 15, 1949.

October 15, 1949.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

Richard Goff appointed Patrol Operator of the Road and Bridge Crew at a salary of \$155.00 a month effective as of October 13, 1949.

The Board discussed Welfare matters with Welfare Director Mildred Watson.

The Board adjourned to inspect and visit the County Convalescent Home.

The Board reconvened in the office of the Board to discuss Road & Bridge matters with County Engineer J. I. Rice.

The following resolution designating bank depositories for public funds was passed by the Board, resolution as follows:

RESOLUTION DESIGNATING BANK DEPOSITORIES FOR PUBLIC FUNDS

WHEREAS, the bond of Melvin Miller, Treasurer of Douglas County, having been accepted and approved, and

WHEREAS, as provided in Section 9-305 of the 1941 Supplement to the General Statutes of Kansas, 1935, the Board of County Commissioners is given authority to designate bank depositories for public funds providing said banks give a good and sufficient bond, and

WHEREAS, it is provided that in lieu of the giving of such bond, said depository banks may deposit with the governing body, security as set out in the law, to the amount of seventy per cent (70%) of the amount which may be on deposit therein by the county at any time, and,

WHEREAS, it is further provided that during the periods of peak deposits occurring at tax paying time and tax distributing time and continuing for a period of not to exceed sixty continuous days at any given time, and not to exceed one hundred and twenty days in any calendar year, the amount of all depository bonds given to secure public deposits shall be reduced in amount by one-half thereof; that is, during such sixty-day period the personal surety bond need only equal in amount the total deposits at any such time and the corporate surety bond need be only fifty per cent (50%) in amount of the total deposits at any such time; and that other security as set out by law, need be only fifty per cent (50%) in amount of the total deposits at any such time, and

WHEREAS, the Statute provides that no bonds for security be required when such deposit is covered by insurance under provisions of the federal deposit insurance fund of the federal deposit insurance corporation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, State of Kansas, in regular adjourned session this 15th day of October, 1949, that the following named banks insured under the F.D.I.C. be designated as depositories of public funds;
