

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD O

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Chapter 68, Section 141 G, of the Laws of Kansas, 1947, provides that the "governing body of any municipality by resolution is authorized and empowered to transfer, annually, from the road, bridge, or street fund of such municipality not to exceed twenty-five percent of the amount of money credited to any such fund, and subject to legal expenditure in such year, to a special road, bridge or street building machinery and equipment fund"; and

WHEREAS, Douglas County has a cash balance of 13,885.11 and an unexpended budget balance of 11,637.99 In its Road Fund as of the end of the fiscal year 1949; and,

WHEREAS, Douglas County operated under a budget appropriation of \$69,000.00 in its Road Fund for the year 1949, 25% of which would total \$17,250.00;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County does hereby authorize its treasurer to transfer \$11,500.00 from its Road Fund to the Special Road Equipment and Machinery Fund, which sum does not exceed 25% of the amount of money which could have been spent as limited by law for the year 1949.
