The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

The Board discussed road and bridge matters with county engineer J.I. Rice.

The following cereal malt beverage licenses were approved by resolution on motion by Ray C. Ogden and second by Charles E. Banning:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 2nd day of January, 1951, the same being a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, of Douglas County, the application of John Dobbins, for a beer license came on for consideration of said Board, and

WHEREAS, the Board does find that the said John Dobbins is in all ways qualified under the law to sell cereal malt beverages for consumption on the premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that due and legal notice has been given to the Wakarusa Township Board and that ten days have expired from the giving of said notice, and that no written objection has been filed by the Wakarusa Township Board, protesting the granting of a beer license.
