The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

Additional bills for equipment and supplies were approved and allowed by the Board as per the Allowance Record.

On motion of Mr. Banning, second by Mr. Ogden, and on vote being called, motion carried, the Board approved a ten per cent (10%) increase in compensation of county officers and county employees, effective as of July 1, 1951, the Board having found it advisable, due to the increase in cost of living, according to law, resolution as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, have met at a regular session on this 16th day of June, 1951, the following Commissioners being present: Chairman Ray C. Ogden, Commissioner Elmer W. Ousdahl and Commissioner Charles E. Banning.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners now finds it advisable to provide additional compensation to all county officers, their deputies, assistants and employees, except employees of the Welfare Department of Douglas County, Kansas which said employees are regulated by Civil Service requirements and consequently cannot be included herein. Said Commissioners further find that said additional compensation shall be ten per cent (10%) of the salary fixed by statute for such officer, deputy, assistant or employee and shall provide for the increase of the amount of any aggregate allowance fixed by statute for the payment of compensation for deputies, clerks, assistants or employees in an amount of ten per cent (10%) of said aggregate allowance. That no such additional compensation shall be paid for services rendered prior to July 1, 1951, nor after June 30, 1953. Further that if any elective officer holds two or more county offices the additional compensation herein provided shall only be applied to the salary for the office to which he was elected. That such additional compensation shall be paid in equal monthly installments and shall become effective and operative on July 1, 1951, and shall be paid even though such expenditure was not included in the county budget for the period which such additional compensation is paid. The Commissioners further find that this resolution is authorized by House Bill 509 and that the provisions herein are intended to comply strictly therewith.
