That said ten per cent (10%) increases shall be paid for services rendered on and after July 1, 1951, and shall cover services rendered up to and including June 30, 1953. That in situations where any elective officer holds two or more county offices; the ten per cent (10%) additional compensation herein provided shall only be applied to the salary for the office to which said officer was elected. Such ten per cent (10%) additional compensation berein monthly installments beginning with July 1, 1951, and extending to but not including July 1, 1953, and shall be paid even though such expenditure was not included in the county budget for the period such additional compensation is paid.
