WHEREAS, notice of such hearing was duly published for three consecutive weeks as provided by law in the Lawrence Daily Journal World, the same being a newspapaer of general circulation in said City, and

WHEREAS, on the aforesaid date and time and at the aforementioned place, the said Board of County Commissioners, all of the members of said Board being present, did proceed to hear testimony as to the advisability of making the addition requested in the above mentioned petition, as provided in 12-502 of G.S., 1949, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, upon such hearing, did find that the adding of the above described property to the said City is to its best interest and will cause no manifest injury to the persons owning real estate in the territory sought to be added.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, in regular adjourned meeting this 30th day of June, 1951, all of the members of said Board being present, that the Governing Body of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, shall have and is hereby granted authority and approval to enlarge the limits of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, by adding thereto the adjacent territory as above described.

On motion of Mr. Ousdahl and second by Mr. Banning, The Board adopted the following rules and regulations governing Lone Star Lake and Park, on vote being called, motion carried:

RESOLUTION

ADOPTING GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR LONE STAR LAKE AND PARK

All laws of the State of Kansas pertaining to fishing in State Lakes are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference herein the same as though set out at length herein, in so far as they are not incomsistent with the provisions herein set out.

Lone Star Lake Park is open and free to the public. Visitors are welcome to use it for the various activities permitted.

1. The destruction of any sign, guidepost, or property of any kind is unlawful. This includes the peeling of bark, carving and chopping trees, cutting branches, driving nails, digging ground from roots, and the removal of trees, shrubs and plants, picking wild flowers, and other injuries.

2. To carry or have firearms in the park is unlawful.

3. Throwing of tin cans, bottles, paper, junk or refuse of any kind on the ground or in the lake; or the misuse or abuse of seats, tables, park buildings, and other park equipment is prohibited.
