

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD O

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December 5, 1951

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session, all members of the Board being present.

The Board met with the Trustees of Wakarusa, Lecompton, Eudora, and Grant Townships as per appointment at 10:00 o'clock A. M. in the office of the Commissioners, in regard to revaluation of flood damaged lands. It was the opinion of the assembled trustees that the Commissioners should order the re-assessment made. On motion by Mr. Ousdahl, second by Mr. Banning, and on vote being taken, motion carried, the Board adopted the following resolution to re-assess flood damaged land the improvements as of the first day of March, 1952:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The State Commission of Revenue and Taxation has ordered and declared that Boards of County Commissioners shall determine the extent of damage wrought by recent floods within their counties and, if any Board decided that damage to any real property within its county is sufficient to warrant a re-appraisal of real estate for assessment and taxation purposes for the year 1952, said Board shall, by resolution, order a re-assessment of said property within the county or any portion thereof, and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County in conference with the township trustees of townships in flood areas has determined that there is damage sufficient to warrant re-appraisals of real estate values,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that real estate, both land and improvements in Lecompton, Wakarusa, Eudora, and Grant Townships affected by flood damage, said areas to be determined by the township trustees of the respective townships, is hereby ordered to be re-assessed for the year 1952.
