The Board entered into the following agreement with Al Powell to erect a stock shed at the 4-H Fairgrounds east of Lawrence for \$700.00:

AGREEMENT

This agreement made and entered into this 21st day of June, 1952, by and between Al Powell, an individual of Douglas County, Kansas, hereinafter referred to as Party of the First Part and the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, hereinafter referred to as Party of the Second Part.

Witnesseth, that said Party of the First Part hereby agrees to furnish all necessary work and labor in constructing a frame building on the 4-H Club Fairgrounds, Douglas County, Kansas, for the total sum of Seven Hundred and no/100 dollars (\$700.00). Said Party of the First Part further fpromises and agrees that said building will be constructed as per plans and specifications which have been examined by him and to which he has affixed his signature on this same date.

In consideration of the promises and agreements of the Party of the First Part hereinbefore Mentioned Party of the Second part agrees to furnish all of building supplies and materials to be used in the construction of said building and to pay to Party of the First Part the total sum of Seven Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$700.00).

It is mutually understood and agreed between the parties hereto that work on said building shall begin immediately after the execution of this Agreement and shall be completed at the earliest possible time by Party of the First Part. It is further mutually understood and agreed between parties that Party of the First Part shall have and receive one-half of the total contract price of said Seven Hundred and no/100 or Three Hundred Fifty and no/100(\$350.00) after said Party of the First Part has performed two-thirds of the total work on said building.

It is mutually understood between both parties that all work is to be performed in a workmanlike manner and all sides of the building to be plumbed and the plates are to be leveled. Further it is mutually understood and agreed that the attached specifications marked Exhibit A are hereby made a 'part of this Agreement, the same as if said plans and specifications had been set out in full herein and Party of the First Part agrees that he shall carefully follow said plans and specifications and complete his work in strict compliance therewith.
