"A joint meeting of the Boards of Jefferson and Douglas Counties was held at the Commissioner's office in Oskaloosa, Friday morning, September 12, at ten o'clock, for the purpose of opening bids for the Reconstruction of the Lecompton Bridge.

The plans and architectural work was done by the firm of Finney and Turnipseed of Topeka. Mr. Frazier and Mr. Turnipseed of that firm were present and presented an estimate for this reconstruction at \$60, 347.00.

The only bid received was from the Universal Bridge Company of Kansas City. Their bid was for \$145,679.00.

A motion that the bid be rejected was entered by Commissioner Ousdahl of Douglas County. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Schuler of Jefferson County. The motion was placed before the Boards for a vote by Chairman Kimmel. The motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Commissioner Yost of Jefferson County as follows: "That Finney and Turnipseed advertise and prepare for another letting. The same to be held on the 14th of November." Motion seconded by Commissioner Ousdahl, and carried unanimously.

It was also agreed by all present, to have this letting at the office of the Douglas County Commissioners in Lawrence."

Additional bills for equipment and supplies were allowed by the Board, as per the Allowance Record.
