RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Section 19-204 of the General Statutes of Kansas for 1949 provides that the Commissioner Districts of a county be altered every three years; and

WHEREAS, the last time a redistricting of Commissioner Districts in Douglas County, Kansas, was made was on May 16, 1938; and

WHEREAS, it now appears that said Commissioner Districts in Douglas County, Kansas, are not as equal in population as they might or should be; and

WHEREAS, the First Commissioner District of Douglas County, Kansas, has a population of 11,913, the Second Commissioner District has a population of 9021 and the Third Commissioner District has a population of 8882, all as shown by the last official census of Douglas County, Kansas, and the Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, find that it is to the best interests of Douglas County, Kansas, that the Commissioner Districts should be redistricted or altered;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That Douglas County, Kansas, be and it is hereby redistricted and altered as provided by law and said Commissioner Districts are now to be comprised of the following areas, to-wit:



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
