NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that additional compensation is hereby allowed to all county officers, their compensation is hereby allowed to all county officers, their deputies, assistants or employees, and additional compensation in the amount of ten percent of any aggregate allowance fixed by Statute for the payment of compensation for deputies, clerks, Assistants or employees. That said ten percent increases shall be paid for services rendered on and after July 1, 1953, and shall remain in force and be effective for services rendered up to and including June 30, 1955. That where any elective officer holds two or more county offices, the ten percent additional compensation herein provided shall apply only to the salary for the office to which said officer was elected and shall not apply to salaries paid to said officer for other than the one office to which he has been elected. Such ten percent additional compensation shall be paid in equal monthly installments beginning with July 1, 1953, and ending with June 30, 1955, and shall be paid even though such expenditure was not included in the county budget for the period such additional compensation is paid. compensation is paid.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that this Resolution and each and every provision thereof is adopted with the sole intent of reinstating salary increases heretofore made by Resolution effective July 1, 1951, under authority of 28-157a of the 1951 Supplement to the General Statutes of Kansas, 1949, said authority under said heretofore cited Statute terminating on June 30, 1953, and this Resolution is based upon Senate Bill No. 90 which makes it possible to extend said salary increases as hereinbefore provided for the period of time extending from July 1, 1953, to and including June 30, 1955, and it is the fur-ther intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, to comply fully and strictly with the new authority and discretion granted said County Commissioners by the enactment of Senate Bill No. 90.
