The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular session with all members of the Board present.

An Agreement with Allen Mohler to construct a dwelling for the caretaker on the 4-H Fairgrounds for a consideration of \$2,500, was entered into by the Board. Agreement follows:

A G R E E M E N T

This agreement entered into this 1st day of August 1953 by and between Allen Mohler of Douglas County Kansas, Party of the First Part, and the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, Party of the Second Part:

Party of the Second Part agrees to place concrete footings on which a concrete block foundation is to be constructed by Party of the First Part.

Party of the First Part also agrees to construct a dwelling house on said foundation with attached garage, according to plans and specifications, marked Exhibit "A", and said plans to be a part of this contract, said dwelling to be constructed on land owned by the County which is known as the 4-H Fairgrounds. Said dwelling house is identical in construction and size with the house built by said Party of the First part at 1601 Barker, Avenue, Lawrence, Kansas, and is to be completely constructed ready for occupancy by Party of the First Part, except Party of the Second Part will do all plumbing, wiring, plastering and sanding and finishing floors, said flooring to be laid by Party of the First Part, and all rooms to be made ready for plastering.

Said Party of the Second Part is to furnish all materials necessary to construct said dwelling and said Party of the First Part is to do all necessary work. Said Party of the First Part is
