The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

Commissioner's Order No. 688 (Tax cancellation) was made by the Board.

The Board discussed welfare matters with the Director, Mrs. Mildred Watson.

The matter of transfer of land belonging to Wakarusa Township, but located in Grant Township, to Grant Township, was discussed with Ernest Klooze, of the County Clerk's office.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Wednesday, December 9 1953.

December 9, 1953.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

The County Clerk was authorized by the Board to purchase assessment supplies in the amount of \$506.50.

The Board discussed the operation of the multigraph in the County Superintendent's office with Mr. Smythe and Mr. Goodman of the Multigraph Company.

Welfare matters were discussed with the Director, Mrs. Mildred Watson.

Motion was made by Mr. Ousdahl, seconded by Mr. Ogden that the elected County Officials be given a 5% raise in salary and the other County Employees who have been in employment of the County one year or more be given a flat \$10.00 increase in pay as of December 1, 1953, and up to and including December, 1954. Motion carried unanimously:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas has met at a regular session on this 9th day of December, 1953, the following Commissioners being present: Chairman Charles E. Banning, Commissioner Elmer W. Ousdahl and Commissioner Ray C. Ogden.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners now finds it advisable to provide additional compensation to all county officers, their deputies, assistants and employees, except employees of the Welfare Department of Douglas County, Kansas, which said employees are regulated by Civil Service requirements and consequently not included herein. Said Commissioners further find that said additional compensation shall be paid to all elective county officers in the amount of five percent of the salary fixed by Statute for each such elective officer, and that all other employees, namely, deputies, assistants and employees, shall receive a flat salary increase of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per month, after each of said deputies, assistants and employees have been employed by Douglas County, Kansas continuously for one year. Further, that the increase herein provided shall be for the period of thirteen months, beginning on December 1, 1953, and continuing until and including December 31, 1954. That no such additional compensation shall be paid for services rendered prior to December 1, 1953, nor after December 31, 1954. That the additional compensation herein provided shall augment the total salary of each county officer, deputy, assistant and employee and be paid in addition to the salary increase resolved on the 27th day of June, 1953.

Any elective officer who holds two or more county offices shall receive the additional compensation hereinbefore provided as five percent of the salary for the office to which he was elected and shall receive no additional compensation for the other office or offices which he holds.

That such additional compensation shall be paid in equal monthly installments and shall become effective and operative on December 1, 1953, and shall be paid even though such expenditure was not included in the county budget for the period for which such additional compensation is paid.

The Commissioners hereby find and determine that this Resolution is authorized by Senate Bill No. 158 of the 1953 Legislature and that said Bill, by specific provisions therein, provides that such salary increases or additional compensation shall be in addition to and not conflict with any of the provisions of Chapter 28 of the General Statutes of 1949, or amendments thereto and Senate Bill No. 90 of the 1953 Legislature or any other statute prescribing compensation for County Officers, deputies, assistants or employees. Further, the Commissioners find and determine that this Resolution is necessary in order to meet the cost of living increase experienced within Douglas County, Kansas, and further, that they intend by this Resolution to comply strictly with the terms and conditions of Senate
