WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, did on the 26th day of June, 1954, file with the County Clerk of Douglas County, Kansas, for authority and approval to enlarge the limits of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, by including the following described tract adjacent to said City within the limits of said City, to-wit:

The NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 35, Township 12,
South, Range 19 East, of the 6th P.M., more
particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the NR Corner of Section 35, thence West a
distance of 1320.0 feet; thence South a distance of
1323.1 feet; thence East a distance of 1322.0 feet; thence
North a distance of 1330.42 feet to the point of
beginning.
