COMMISSIONER'S RECORD O

January 1, 1955, and continuing until and including December 31, 1955. That no such additional compensation shall be paid for services rendered after December 31, 1955. That the additional compensation herein provided shall augment the total salary of each county officer, deputy, assistant and employee and be paid in addition to the salary increase resolved on the 27th day of June, 1953.

Any elective officer who holds two or more county offices shall receive the additional compensation hereinbefore provided as five percent of the salary for the office to which he was elected and shall receive no additional compensation for the other office or offices which he holds.

That such additional compensation shall be paid in equal monthly installments and shall become effective and operative on January 1, 1955, and shall be paid even though such expenditure was not included in the county budget for the period for which such additional compensation is paid.

The Commissioners hereby find and determine that this Resolution is authorized by Senate Bill No. 158 of the 1953 Legislature and that said bill, by specific provisions therein, provides that such salary increases or additional compensation shall be in addition to and not conflict with any of the provisions of Chapter 28 of the General Statutes of 1949, or amendments thereto and Senate Bill No. 90 of the 1953 Legislature or any other statute prescribing compensation for County Officers, deputies, assistants or employees. Further, the Commissioners find and determine that this Resolution is necessary in order to meet the cost of living increase experienced within Douglas County, Kansas, and further, that they intend by this Resolution to comply strictly with the terms and conditions of Senate Bill 158 of the 1953 Legislature.

Senate Bill 158 of the 1953 Legislature. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that salary increases or additional compensation is hereby allowed to all County Officers, their deputies, assistants or employees in the amounts and upon the conditions following: All elective county officers are hereby granted increases in the amount of five percent of the salary fixed by Statutes for such officer and all other deputies, assistants or employees, of permanent classification, are hereby allowed a flat salary or compensation increase of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per month to those deputies, assistants or employees who have been employed continuously by Douglas County, Kansas for a period of one year. That said increases shall be paid for services rendered on and after January 1, 1955, and shall remain in full force and be effective for services rendered up to and including December 31, 1955. That where any elective officer holds two or more county offices, the five percent additional compensation herein provided shall apply only to the salary, as fixed by Statute, for the office to which said officer than the one office to which he was elected. Such additional salary or compensation shall be paid to elective officers, as hereinbefore provided, and to all deputies, assistants and employees, in the amount and upon the conditions hereinbefore provided, in equal monthly installments, beginning with January 1, 1955, and ending December 31, 1955, and shall be paid even though such expenditure was not included in the county budget for the period for which said additional compensation is paid.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that this Resolution and each and every provision thereof is adopted with the sole intent of granting salary or compensation increases necessitated by cost of living increases and authorized by Senate Bill No. 158 of the 1953 Legislature which said Senate Bill 158, by its own terms, provides for compensation in addition to and not in conflict with any of the provisions of Chapter 28 of the General Statutes of 1949, or amendments thereto, and Senate Bill No. 90 of the 1953 Legislature, or any other Statute prescribing compensation for county officers, deputies, assistants or employees, and it is the further intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, to fully and strictly comply with the authority and discretion granted said County Commissioners by the enactment of said Senate Bill No. 158.
