NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that \$65,000.00, which is an amount not to exceed 25% of the amount of money credited to the road and bridge fund be transferred to a special road, bridge or street building machinery, equipment and bridge building fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be delivered to the County Treasurer and said Treasurer shall credit an amount of \$65,000.00 of the money credited to the road and bridge fund to a special road, bridge, or street building machinery, equipment and bridge building fund. That the adoption of this Resolution is authorized by and is in conformity with Section 68-141 (g) of the 1953 Supplement to the General Statutes of Kansas, 1949, and further that all money credited to such special fund as set up by the adoption of this Resolution shall be used for the purpose of purchasing road, bridge, or street building machinery or equipment, or the building of bridges subject to the hereinbefore cited statute.
