The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

Road and bridge matters were discussed with County Engineer, J. I. Rice.

It was moved by Mr. Ousdahl and seconded by Mr. Harris that we adopt and approve Resolution #2045 of the City of Lawrence pertaining to the improvement of West 19th Street, and that we declare it a public utility. \*A RESOLUTION RELATING TO GRADING, CURBING, AND OTHERWISE IMPROVING NINETEENTH STREET FROM THE WEST LINE OF UNIVERSITY FIELD ADDITION, TO HIGHWAY 59. ALSO KNOWN AS THE EAST LINE OF IOWA STREET, IN THE CITY OF LAWRENCE, KANSAS, FIXING AND DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THAT PART OF THE BENEFIT DISTRICT LYING WITHOUT THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF SAID CITY AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE COST THEREOF.
