RESOLUTION

"A RESOLUTION RELATING TO GRADING, CURBING, AND OTHERWISE IMPROVING NINETEENTH STREET FROM THE WEST LINE OF UNIVERSITY FIELD ADDITION, TO HIGHWAY 59, ALSO KNOWN AS THE EAST LINE OF IOWA STREET, IN THE CITY OF LAWRENCE, KANSAS, FIXING AND DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THAT PART OF THE BENEFIT DISTRICT LYING WITHOUT THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF SAID CITY AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE COST THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, has met at a regular adjourned session of said Board on this 14th day of March, 1955, the following Commissioners being present; Chairman Charles E. Banning, Commissioner Elmer W. Cusdahl, and Commissioner D. M. Harris.

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, has received a Resolution No. 2045 from the city officials of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, as provided in Section 12-648 of the General Statutes of Kansas, 1949, which said Resolution relates to the grading, curbing and paving of Nineteenth Street within said City of Lawrence, and the West adjacent street lying West of the City limits of said City and extending to Highway 59 and which said street connects with existing paving in the City of Lawrence and extends along the most direct feasible route to the corporate limits from said Nineteenth Street West to Highway 59, and 59, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County Kansas, has considered said Resolution and finds that it should be adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, thatResolution No. 2045 of the City of Lawrence, Kansas, be adopted and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas:

SECTION I. That it is expedient and necessary, and in the public interest, to grade, curb, and pave Nineteenth Street in the City of Lawrence, Kansas, and the connecting street which lies West of the corporate limits of said city and extends West to Highway 59, being a distance of less than five-eights of a mile in the country outside the corporate limits and that said proposed improvement is declared a public utility, and that the cost thereof be paid as provided in Sections 12-647 to 12-655B inclusive, of the General Statutes of Kansas, 1949

SECTION II. That the part or portion of the total cost of making said improvement as provided by law, to be paid for by said county in the manner provided by law, which bond shall be paid in ten annual assessments to be levied upon lots, lands, or parcels of land, situated within said benefit district and upon property in the County at large upon the following basis: Thirty percent of the total cost of said improvement to be paid for by the County at Large, and twenty percent thereof shall be paid and assessed against land in that part of the benefit district lying outside and without the corporate limits of said city, as provided for in Section 12-652 of the General Statutes of Kansas, 1949.

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
